### Analysis on Student Satisfaction Survey 2021-22

Students' satisfaction is the prime importance of any educational institution. Our students were asked questions on teaching-learning & other activities of the college. On the basis of their response the following analysis is made. Above 90% of the students agreed that 85-to 100% of syllabus is covered in the class and about 22% students said that about 70-84% syllabus is covered in class. However, almost all agreed that the teachers prepare well in class and also communicate properly with them. They have graded the teachers approach towards teaching as excellent, very good & good. All of them agreed that internal evaluation is always fair & most of them (80% & above) agreed that the performance of their assignments are discussed in class. 33% of students agreed that the institute takes interest in promoting internship student exchange program etc regularly & further 42% said they do this quite often. The teaching and mentoring process in the institution facilitates the students in cognitive, social and emotional growth & provides opportunities to learn & grow. About 90% of the student agreed that teachers inform them about their course outcomes, Program outcomes & also mentor the assigned tasks to them. About 95% of students also agreed that the teachers illustrate the concepts through example, practical applications & also identify their strength and encourage them with the right level of challenges. Teachers also help them to identify their weakness & help them to overcome them. Also, above 90% students agreed that this institution makes effort to improve teaching learning process and the teachers use student centric methods such as experimental learning, participative learning & problem solving methodologies. Almost all of them agreed that teachers encourage them to participate in extra-curricular activities. More than 50% students agreed that efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills & employability skills. Most of the teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, multimedia etc while teaching. About 95% of students agreed that the overall quality of the teaching-learning process in the institute is very good.

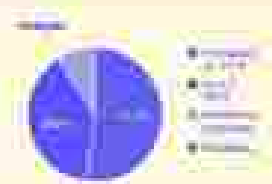


Number of products rejected as a function of the number of products rejected in the previous step. The distribution is skewed towards higher numbers of rejected products.

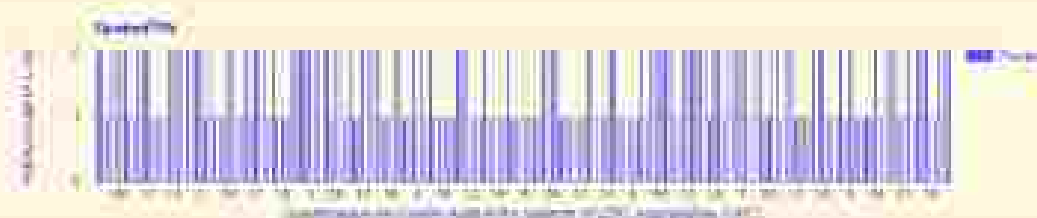
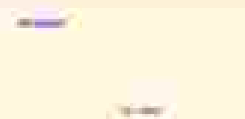


### Analysis on Students Feedback 2021-22

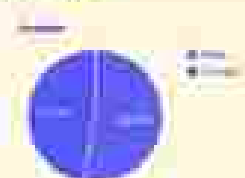
Teaching-Learning interaction in today's date demands high quality internet facility. All students of our college agree that they have good internet facility which they access mainly through smart phones and then with the laptop/desktop. About 74% of students agree that many classes are held through online apps like Zoom, Google Meet, Skype, Team Link etc. Google classroom is the mostly used platform for online teaching which 94% of students agree. Our students also prefer online classes with e-learning material while staying at home. About 67% of students agree online classes are useful for them. More than 70% students are satisfied with the online classes using different online platforms. These online classes are conducted regularly & it is preferred by most of the students as it is time saving & easy to attend. Almost all (above 90%) students agree that the teachers generate interest in their subjects, and also communication skills and knowledge bases of their teachers are good. Above 80% of the students agree that they can access their teachers outside the class hours regarding academic consultations. Same percentages (80%) of students agree that the teachers take initiative in formulating tests/quiz/exam & maintain fairness in evaluating students' performance & complete the syllabus before exams in a through manner. Though almost all (95%) of students are aware that the college arrange essay/competition, Debate competition, Publication of journal etc. but not even half of them joins the program because of poor internet connection & difficulty in concentrating online. However, those of them joined mostly (above 80%) agreed that they are satisfied with these programs. 69% of the students agreed that they are mentally stressed with this pandemic situation & out of them 44% require mental counseling programs. 88% of students are aware of career guidance program & 52% of them find it helpful. About 90% of the students agreed that online-offline library & e-resources of the college are helpful and also online admission of the college is fair & just. About 85% of all students agreed that they are satisfied with the co-operation & interaction from the college.

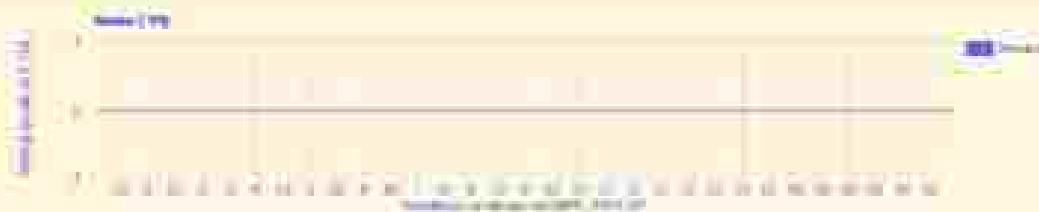
### Analysis of Gender Audit of students of Vijaygarh Jyotish Ray College , 2021-22

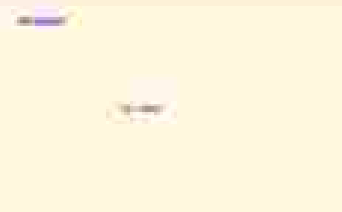

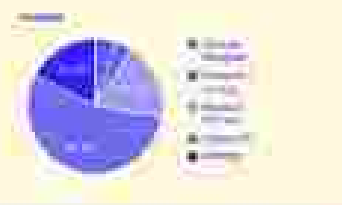

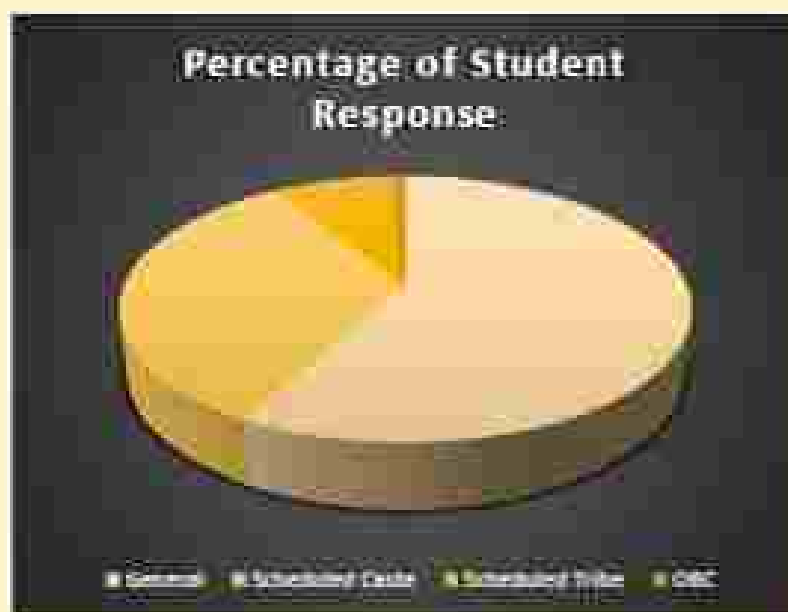
### Analysis of Feedback on Library of Vijaygarh Jyotish Ray College , 2021-22

#### Analysis:

Some questions are reported in diagrammatically as these are quantitative in nature and some parts of questions are summarized only in words as they are qualitative in nature

- 1) Students enrolled in our college are from different casts. 58% students came from General category, 33% came from SC category, 8% from ST category and 1% from OBC category.
- 2) Most of the students of our college came from within Kolkata (78%), 22% came from other districts of our State. No students got admission from there states.
- 3) Students from different boards like CBSE, ISC, WBCHSE etc. took admission in our college. Although mostly (80%) were from WB board (i.e WBCHSE). 10% students from CBSE and 8% from ISC and rest 2% from other State boards.
- 4) 83% of the enrolled students learning 60% and above ranks obtained in class XII. 18% students having marks 90% and above in class XII.
- 5) 88% of the enrolled students got 60% and above marks in the last semester. 17% students obtained 90% and above marks in the said examination.
- 6) We also asked our students to state the number of family members in their faith. Survey reports reveal that about 75% students having family members from 3 to 5.

13% students having family members less than 3 and 12% students having greater than 5 members in the family.

- 7) We also asked our students to state the total number of siblings they have. We observed that, 43% having one sibling, 30% and 7% respectively having two and more than 2 siblings, 20% students having no sibling.
- 8) On the being of the reported annual income (approximate), we noticed that most of the students were coming from poor family background. 91% students reported that their annual family income is less than 5 lakh. Only 9% student's annual family income is having than 5 lakh.
- 9) Only 49% students reported that their parents having less than educational qualification (37% reported Graduate, 9% reported Post Graduate 3% reported having Ph.D and above). 29% and 22% of the students reported that their parents just completed 10th Standard and 12th Standard Educational Qualification.
- 10) Mainly mother helped our students in their early education (61%). Student's father (18%), class teacher (15%) and private tutor (6%) were also played an important role in the early stage of student's education.
- 11) 63% students prefer Online mode in pandemic situation. But, many students can't prefer this because of the fact that they cannot interact with teachers, not only that they also feel boring.
- 12) Most of the students (71%) prefer to carry forward with the same subject in the PG level.
- 13) Most of the students (82%) said that mentoring process is beneficial for them as it helps them towards career enhancement, planning for further education, job etc.

#### **14. Mode of Transport**

Our college students mainly avail public transports like train, bus, auto rickshaw as mode of transportation to reach the college. Local students generally attain college by walking or use bi-cycle.

#### **15. Time to reach College**

The time duration taken by most of the students is 10 to 45 mins. Few of them who travel a long distance takes a duration of 1 to 1.5 hours.

#### **16. Subject Selection**

Students mainly opt their subjects as per their own interest. They basically try to enhance their knowledge as well as skill in the field of area of interest.

### **17. Interest part of the Syllabus**

Students are not satisfied with the whole syllabus of their respective subjects. Some parts of the syllabus they prefer most and some parts are not. For example, students from Microbiology department prefer Virology, Genetics and Industrial Microbiology as a subject of interest. Similarly, Students of Philosophy highly prefer Indian Philosophy and Buddhist Philosophy.

### **18. Online teaching mode**

Maximum students prefer online classes in Pandemic Situation. But, in generally, they denies this mode of teaching because of the fact that they cannot interact with teachers, not only that they also feel boring.

### **19. Academic help**

Students prefer more face-to-face classes to understand the subject matter of each subject clearly. Students from practical oriented subjects suggest for more practical classes for better hand on understanding.

### **20. Self-judgement for improving the academic results**

Most of the students believe that rigorous practice, continuous writings and group discussions are helpful for improving the academic results.

Most of the students (mainly girl students) want to become teachers after completion of Ph.D work. Boy students want to have small business plan, love to invest or have a start-up of their own.

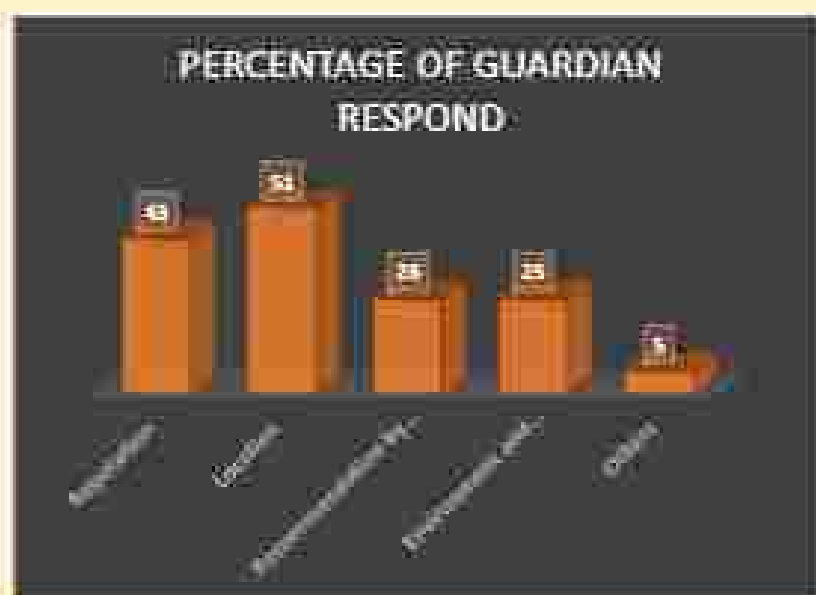

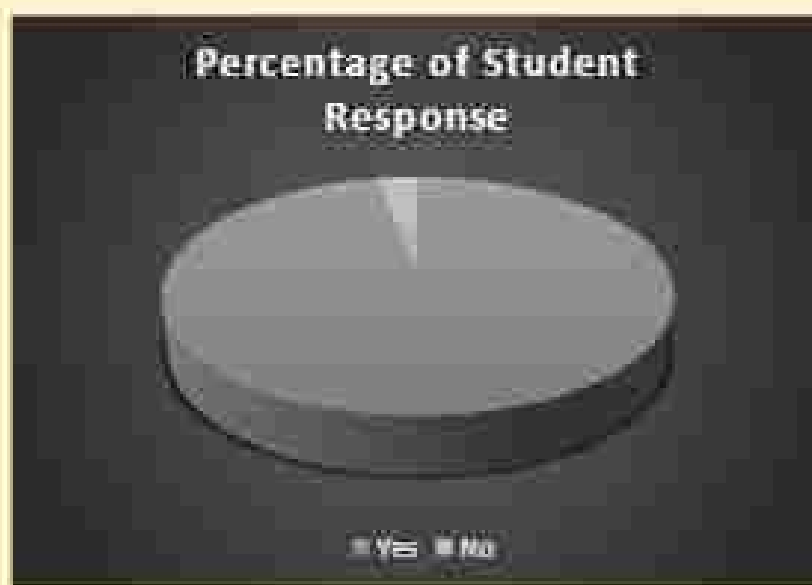
### Analysis:

## Analysis:

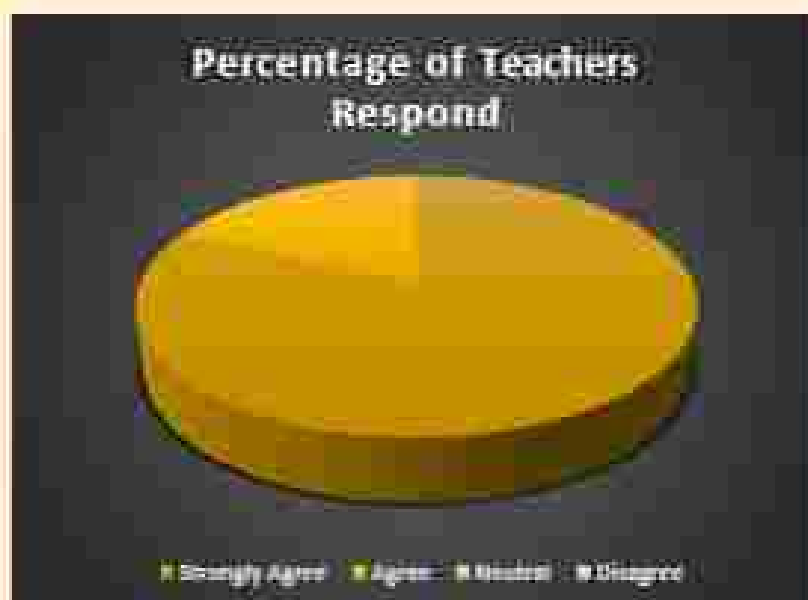

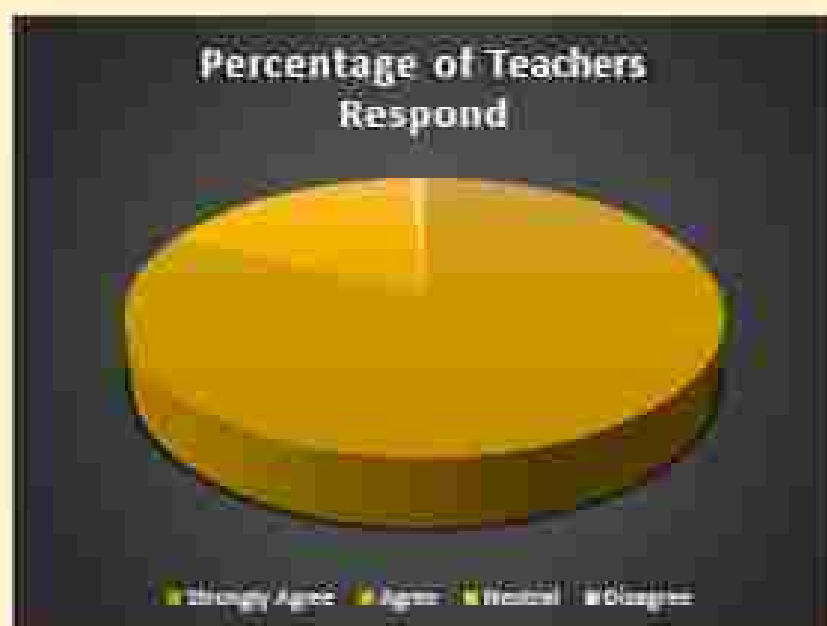

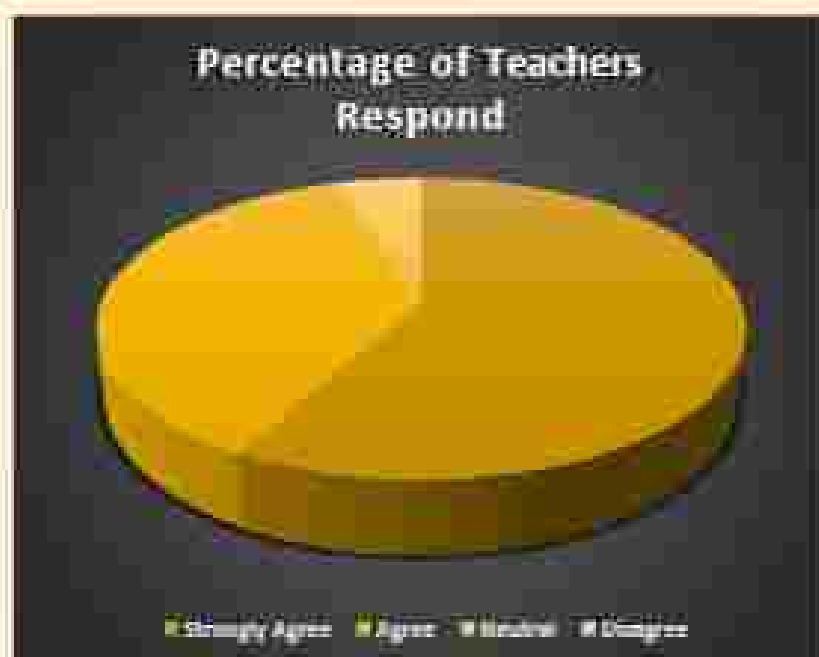

### Analysis:
