

Special Edition on 125th birth day of Netaji Subhash Chandre Bose kolkata 23rd January 2021

NETAJI SUBHASH CHADRA BOSE 125TH BIRTHDAY

Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose born on 23rd January, 1897, Cuttack, Orissa. His father's name was Janakinath Bose and mother's name was Prava-vati Dutt. He was an Indian nationalist whose defiant patriotism made him a hero in India, but whose attempt during World War II to rid India of British rule with the help of Nazi Germany and Imperial Japan left a troubled legacy. Subhash Chandra Bose followed Jawaharlal Nehru to leadership in a younger wing of the Indian National Congress, one that was less moderately constitutional in the late 1920s and more open to socialism in the 1930s. He rose to become Congress President in 1938. However, soon after being reelected in 1939, he was ousted from congress leadership positions following differences with Mahatma Gandhi and the Congress high command. He was subsequently placed under house arrest by the British before escaping from India in 1940. His refusal to remain in prison at this critical period of India's history was expressed in a determination to fast to death, which frightened the British Government into releas-

ing him. On January 26, 1941, though closely watched, he escaped from his Calcutta residence in disguise and travelling Via Kabul and Moscow, eventually reached Germany in April. In Nazi Germany Bose came under the tutelage of a newly created special Bureau for India, guided by Adam Von Trott Zu Solz. He and other Indians who had gathered in Berlin made



regular broadcasts from the German sponsored Azad Hind Radio beginning in January 1942, speaking in English, Hindi, Bengali, Tamil, Telugu, Gujarati and Pashto. A little more than a year after the Japanese invasion of southeast Asia, Sub-

hash -Chundra Bose left Germany, travelling by German and By plane, and arrived in May 1943 in Tokyo. On July 4 he assumed leadership of the Indian Independence Movement in East Asia and Proceeded, with Japanese aid and influence, to form a trained army of about 40,000 troops in Japanese occupied southeast Asia. On October 21, 1943, Subhash Chandra Bose proclaimed the establishment of a provisional independent Indian government, and his so-called Indian National Army (Azad Hind Fauj), alongside Japanese troops, advanced to Rangoon and thence overland into India reaching Indian soil on March 18, 1944, and moving into Kohima and the plains of Imphal. In a stubborn battle, the mixed Indian and Japanese forces, lacking Japanese air support, were defeated and forced to retreat; the Indian National Army nevertheless for some time succeeded in maintaining its identity as a liberation army, based in Burma and then Indochina. With the defeat of Japan, however, Bose's fortunes ended. A few days after Japan's announced surrender in August 1945, Bose, fleeing Southeast Asia, reportedly died in a Japanese hospital in Taiwan as a result of burn injuries from a plane crash

Netaji: India's Pride

Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose was born 23rd January, in 1897 Cuttack(Orissa), to Prabhavati Dutt Bose and Janakinath Bose. He did his schooling from Protestant European School, he did baccalaureate from the Presidency college. He was send by his parents to the University of Cambridge in England to prepare for the Indian Civil Service. In 1920 he passed the Civil Service examination, but in April 1921 after hearing Nationalist turmoil in India, he resigned his candi- dacy and hurried back to India. Netaji was an Indian nationalist whose patriotism towards India has left a mark in the hearts of many Indians. He was the president of the All India Congress and also the secretary of Bengal state Congress. In 1924, he became CEO of Municipal Corporation and later became Mayor of

Calcutta. He joined the Non-Cooperation movement which was started by Mahatma Gandhi. He started the newspaper "Swaraj" in 1927 after being released. He became General Secretary of the Congress Party and worked for independence in 1938 he was elected president of the Indian National Congress.

The date of the great Indian Nationalist occurred from the third degree burns on 18th August 1945 after the overboarded Bomber in which he was being transport- ed by the Japanese crashed many of the supporters refused to believe that the fact or circumstances of his day conspiracy theories appeared since then and have persisted since then keeping alive various material myths about Bose.
